NEST Concludes Operations

For almost 30 years we have conducted NEST thanks to all the leaders among you who have stepped into difficulties, taught volunteers, and new churches, managed the NEST program at your church or synagogue, taken up challenges, and embraced our guests. For that, we thank you.

Though we were originally moving towards registering NEST as a 501c3 prior to Covid (with Martha Gorman spearheading that goal), given our present situation, the Administrative Team has voted to formally dissolve since the city has taken over sheltering for homeless persons in Norfolk. This article covers the conclusion of NEST operations, its distribution of assets and funds.

Our mat and blanket inventory, formerly kept at Cornerstone Baptist by Teri and Kevin Vinson, was first offered to the city who declined. HER (a woman's shelter), St Columba, and the Catholic Worker, picked up the ones they could use with the remainder being given to My Renew (a program like NEST).

In addition to an annual grant from the city, NEST received donations from the church community and civic organizations dedicated to helping the homeless. As Covid progressed and the city took over sheltering, we ceased allowing donations but were left with \$77,621.53 in funds. After receiving input from many of our volunteers, the Administrative Team decided to keep the original intent for the funds---to support churches and agencies that were continuing to assist the homeless in Norfolk by serving meals such as: Blessed Sacrament, Beth El, Wesley Grace, Sacred Heart, New Hope CCC, St Mary's Basilica, Miles Memorial, Norview Baptist, Christ and St Lukes, Central Baptist, Crossroads, First Baptist Bute Street, First Lutheran, First Presbyterian, Freemason Street Baptist and Ohef Sholom. The following agencies who support the homeless will also receive funds: FoodBank, Norfolk Street Choir Project, St. Columba, Ghent Area Ministry, and the Catholic Worker. Any remaining funds will be used to purchase bus tickets.

We would like to thank the Administrative Team whose members also served as Duty Officers throughout the season: John Case, Diane Collins, Barbara Craig, Gloria Emanuel, Martha Gorman, Dave Hutcheson, Merrie Jo Milner, Anne Odell, Tracey Trimyer and Stephanie Van Leeuwen. Thank you to Tracey Trimyer who managed our bank account and to Martha Gorman who wrote the thank you notes to donors.

Thank you for continuing to support and embrace those among us who are homeless.

Sheltering for the Homeless in Norfolk—Update

The City's new initiative focused on sheltering the homeless has replaced NEST and is providing yearround sheltering and services.

The city-run Center at Greyhound Bus Station (701 Monticello Ave) provided day services and overnight lodging from May to October 14, 2021, for adults experiencing street homelessness in Norfolk. (80 overnight and additional -20 daily day services guests)

On October 14, 2021, the new location "The Housing Center on Tidewater" (The Center) at 1050 Tidewater Drive (former Budget Lodge) opened. This Center is open every day and night throughout the entire year. Adults from Norfolk who are experiencing street homelessness are eligible for admission to the day center. Persons wanting an overnight bed must go to the day center in person 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM or be brought to the center by outreach. Case managers will assess their situation for eligible admission and/or waitlist for a bed. No minors (under 18 years old) are allowed. Day center guests are provided access to all services at the Center including showers, laundry, case management, and additional services. About one hundred guests are housed overnight. During the Winter Season, this site will also provide for overflow during the WOW nights (weather which is dangerous for individuals to remain outdoors).

The "confirmation portion" is organized and directed by the pastors of the participating churches, while the staff and counselors of Caroline Furnace provide all the excitement and fun of an outdoor summer camp. Attending Confirmation Camp at least one time is a required component of our Confirmation Program at First Lutheran, however, since each summer is a little different, many students enjoy the opportunity to attend more than once.

The dates for this year's Confirmation Camp are June 26th – July 1st. Our departure time on Sunday will be as soon after our morning worship time as possible.
